

Interlibrary Loan (ILL)

Most library genealogy material is designated as Reference material and cannot be checked out. There might be exceptions to this, however, and requests to borrow items not owned by the Appleton Public Library or the OWLS libraries an sometimes be made. These items can be requested at the Appleton Public Library with your library card. Another option is to have the Appleton Library request copies of a book's table of contents or index and then copies of specific pages. There will be a charge for the photocopying.

Libraries will not loan books directly to individuals, but you may contact libraries directly to request copies of pages from books or from microfilm. Costs for this service vary and you may wish to designate a maximum charge that you are willing to pay.

Research Tips on Gathering Your Family Information

- 1. Interview your parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins. Ask them birth dates and places, marriage dates and places, who the person married, death dates and places. Begin with current dates and work backwards.
- 2. Vital records are an important source of family information. These records can be obtained through county and state agencies. The following types of records are available:
 - a. Birth certificates show parents and sometimes other valuable information.
 - b. Marriage certificates show ages, parents, witnesses and other information.
 - c. Death certificates show death dates, birth dates, parents and much more information including causes of death, etc.
- 3. Obituary notices found in local newspapers will provide you with a wealth of individual and family member information.
- 4. Church records (Baptismal, Marriage, Membership, etc.) on your family will provide you with as much information as vital records in some cases.
- 5. Visit cemeteries where you know your ancestors are buried and look for other family members. Write down all information found on tombstones.
- 6. Family photo albums and scrapbooks will help you with basic information and are often a source of new and valuable data.
- 7. Census records on microfilm may be available at some libraries or historical societies. Begin with the 1930 Census and work backwards. Census records have been taken since 1790. This will help you fill in the missing pieces and find family members.
- 8. Many local libraries and historical societies have local history collections. Family histories, biographies, plat books, and pamphlets are among the resources available for your investigation.
- 9. Search engines (Google, Yahoo, Webcrawler, InfoSeek) on the Internet can be used to look for names. Search results may lead you to out-of-state contacts and resources.
- 10. Information that you get on each ancestor can be recorded on a form called a Family Group Sheet. It is recommended to do one sheet per family member.
- 11. The courthouse is another place to check for records of your ancestors. Look for deeds, probate (wills, estate, intestate), voters' records, or any kind of legal papers that would have been filed in a courthouse.
