

# World Vital Records


World Vital Records provides access to over 158 million digitized images, including US and UK censuses; birth, marriage and death records from around the world; military records; newspapers; map collections; yearbooks; and tombstones. New records are added each month.

World Vital Records may be used in the library, when you won't need to sign in. When outside the library sign in with your library card. Go to [www.apl.org](http://www.apl.org), then the "elibrary" tab. From the dropdown menu, choose "A-Z". **World Vital Records** is #99.

Click on the title to go to the Library Access sign-in page. Enter your library card number with no spaces, and click the orange button.



You can search all collections at once from the main search box on the home page. You do not need to fill in every box, but you need **at least one parameter**. If you need ideas on how to search, click "Search help".



World Vital Collections includes family trees from My Heritage. Names of living people may be protected, and thus not viewable in the trees. To get more information on a record you would contact the owner of the tree. Some trees have been listed as private so you will not be able to view them.

Remember that not all entries are accurate—it is better to use them as a guide rather than treat them as absolutely true. Look for sources documenting each fact.
